Emergency Medicine is a crucial specialty coming of age in a time when health insurance and access to care are compelling societal concerns. While Emergency Medicine was not intended to be a safety net, we increasingly find that our daily practice is composed of interesting and challenging problems that extend beyond triage, treatment, and disposition of medical emergencies.

WashU is a four-year residency founded in 1997. Since our inception we've graduated 278 alumni, who have practiced in nearly all 50 states and over 20 countries. Our graduates go on to pursue careers in both academic and community Emergency Medicine, as well as any of the myriad fellowships available in our specialty (many of which are available right here at WashU). We have adult and pediatric faculty working across the spectrum of emergency medicine including critical care, EMS, ultrasound, toxicology, neurologic emergencies, research, education, pediatric emergency medicine, sports medicine, and global health.
